Perth Airport Air Traffic Control Tower



DID you know Airservices Australia, Australia's government owned air traffic controller, manages 11 per cent of the world's airspace, controlling air traffic operations for over 90 million passengers on more than four million flights every day? My colleague Senator Dean Smith and I recently visited Perth Airport's air traffic control tower to gain a first-hand insight into the tower's operations and the incredible growth that has occurred in Perth airspace in recent years.

Air traffic control at Perth airport currently processes 530-540 air craft movements on its busy days, hundreds of which are fly-in-fly-out operators moving workers to every corner of our State.

Thankyou to Perth Airport tower manager Mike Tesser and Stephen Doyle from Airservices Australia who provided us with an interesting tour of the tower which plays a vital role in ensuring operations run smoothly at Perth Airport.



Foyer Oxford

FOYER Oxford is a great new initiative providing young people at risk of or experiencing homelessness with transitional housing for up to two years and a pathway to education and employment. Foyer Oxford houses 98 young people at any one time including 24 young parents and their children. At the heart of the Foyer Model is the establishment of the "something-for-something" Foyer 'Deal' which matches signed commitments made by the young person with a formal Foyer 'service guarantee' where residents are expected to engage in education, training or employment, meet with support workers, and meet the obligations that come with a normal lease.

During the visit I caught up with Foyer Oxford manager Jethro Sercombe and Anglicare WA CEO Ian Carter and was extremely impressed by the work the organisation is doing to change the lives of young West Australians.



Fremantle Port School Visit

LAST week I returned to the Port School in Fremantle to witness the progress of a Young Parents Training Centre currently under construction at the school. The facility was funded through the Federal Government's Capital Grants Program and will allow young parents to continue their education while learning valuable life and social skills. It was also great to attend the end-of-year ceremony and celebrate the achievements of year 10 students. I am extremely passionate about the plight of Australia's young people, and it is important we provide all children with the best possible start regardless of their background.
